Desperation.

God—you're my God!
I can't get enough of you!
I've worked up such hunger and thirst for God,
traveling across dry and weary deserts.
So here I am in the place of worship, eyes open,
drinking in your strength and glory.
In your generous love I am really living at last!
My lips brim praises like fountains.
I bless you every time I take a breath;
My arms wave like banners of praise to you.
(Psalm 63: 1-4, MSG)

In preparation for the start of another teaching series (one that deals a lot with the life of David), I've been swimming in the Psalms and 1 Samuel quite consistently. After a mini, silent sabbatical I took over the course of last Monday, I came across Psalm 63, which invariably caused me to stop and take spiritual stock.

Go ahead. Review the verses above. Pour over each word on purpose. Make it your own: "Lord, you're mine...and I can't believe it. I can't get enough of you. There's nothing and no one for whom I hunger and thirst more than you. Worship, therefore, isn't an option for me inasmuch as it's an obsession. Only out of your love do I know what it means to live. The movement of my lips and limbs are simply billboard displays of a love that runs deep."

Can I ask a question that I hope you'll honestly consider? When's the last time Psalm 63 described your spiritual state? Now, obviously, we have our ups and downs; (David did too) The Psalmist wasn't always surging...(neither are we) But this word challenges us to chart our spiritual status. Turn the pages of the recent past and detail the descriptors you'd insert into your own psalm. What would you use?

"Disappointment with?"

"Disagreement over?"


"Discord between?"

"Division around?"

What about, "desperation for?" Mmmm. That's where Psalm 63 slapped me in the face. Oh, we've been fervent in stating our case or winning our side. When's the last time you've been desperate for God? That said, maybe our issue isn't discord or disappointment; perhaps the problem isn't a lack of disagreement or division; rather, could it be that we're devoid of desperation? What if the locus of our concern was on the latter and not the former? Have you felt distance? The Psalmist reminds us: the depth of our relationship with Him is proportionate to our desperation for Him.

Flesh on Faith

At the spring United Women in Faith's Spiritual Growth Retreat our guest speaker, Janet Wolf (elder in the UMC – look her up!) spoke about the importance of putting flesh on our faith and the idea really resonated with me. The women from WLU Campus Ministry did just that when we traveled to Wilmington, NC to do some service work. We worked with the Food Bank of Central and Eastern North Carolina helping neighbors in need. The Food Bank sorts all the bulk vegetables from local farmers that grow food for them and re-packages it into smaller amounts to be handed out by local agencies such social service groups and churches. We packaged carrots, sweet potatoes, and the biggest heads of cabbage you've ever seen!! They also have a self-service pantry that allows people to shop for things they like and need, in a friendly, market environment. We also received a tour of the warehouse where all the produce and non-perishable items are stored. It was meaningful to work with the agency and other volunteers knowing this organization is vital to so many in the community.



In New Hanover County in Wilmington, NC all second graders get to learn to swim! What a fantastic opportunity for kids, some of which don't have access to swimming attire, let alone a swimming pool. Local agencies work with the school district and the YWCA to provide the swim suits, towels, and lessons needed for the children to learn to swim. We jumped into the pool and helped several groups of kids start to learn the basics of swimming. We provided support and encouragement to the little ones who were just learning to get their faces wet, float, and learn some swimming strokes. There are populations of kids who simply don't have access to swimming. It could be a transportation issue, training isn't always available in some locations, and cost is often an impediment to learning to swim. These local agencies and churches have committed to this program and everyone involved gets splashed with the love and joy of learning a new skill, giving of ourselves, and showing kindness to others.



Experiences like this help us to put flesh on our faith. Our students came away from the week thankful for the opportunity to serve and appreciating a new bond with the other sisters of Campus Ministry.

During the summer I will be meeting with potential students, attending new student orientations, and planning programs for the 2024-2025 academic year. I ask for your prayers as we move into a new phase of Campus Ministry for the upcoming year.




